Nebraska Bank Robbed of \$2,268,700 in 1930

But Only \$24,276 Was in Cash;
the Remainder Was in Securities

LINCOLN, Neb., Jan. 17 (AP)—On Sept. 15, 1930, machine-gun bands robbed the Lincoln National Bank of \$2,268,700.

Inside tonight's robbery of the Lincoln National Bank, which gunmen took more than \$2,268,700 in cash, the severe men who held the National Bank got only \$24,276 in cash. The rest was in securities.

With an armed man at the wheel of a getaway car and another man in the front entrance of the bank, the men and women and studied their way to the vault.

They couldn't get into the vault because the men who were the combination was out.

A telephone report that there was a big fight at the bank brought two police to the scene.

They quickly observed a machine-gunner enter in last 11, and drove to the police station to get help.

Only two men were convicted in connection with the robbery.

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From Chicago, was arrested but told Nebraska's Atty. Gen. C. A. Borah and other officials that if they would drop all charges against him, he would produce \$400,000 in negotiable securities taken from the Lincoln bank. The charges were dropped and a few days later \$400,000 in securities were returned. Winkler had been in Buffalo the day of the robbery.

It took 15 years to settle the affairs of the bank which eventually paid off all its depositors and stockholders.

It all happened so quickly I don't think I can remember a great deal about the whole thing. It seems like a dream.

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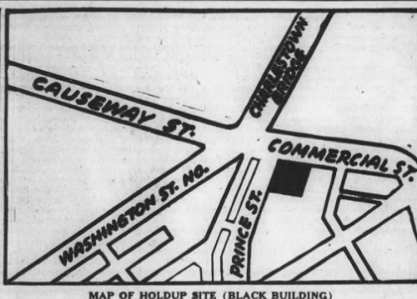
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MAP OF HOLDUP SITE (BLACK BUILDING)
