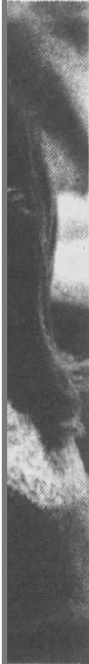

Hyde theft plot sentence given

BALLSTON SPA — Brian Michael McDevitt was sentenced Monday to two years in jail on his guilty plea to charges stemming from a plot to steal art works from the Hyde Collection in Glens Falls in December of 1980.

McDevitt, 22, of Swampscot, Mass., and Michael B. Morey, 31, of Queensbury, originally were charged with kidnapping and robbery. They were accused of abducting a Federal Express driver in their alleged attempt to steal Hyde art treasures.

The attempt failed when the two men

became tied up in holiday traffic in the stolen truck. The driver was not injured during the incident.

Morey pleaded guilty in November to a reduced charge of attempted robbery. He was sentenced to 60 days in the county jail. He is now out on probation for five years.

Appearing before Saratoga County Judge Loren N. Brown Monday, McDevitt pleaded guilty to reduced charges of attempted grand larceny and unlawful imprisonment. He will serve his two-year sentence in the county jail.
